**CHIANTI CLASSICO DOCG  
RISERVA VIGNA IL POGGIALE**

The cru of Chianti Classico. A Reserve originated from a single vines and has obtained the highest scores for its elegance and uniqueness. A wine showing the huge potentials of Sangioveto.

**Characteristics:**

An elegant wine, fine with soft tannins in flavour.

**Bouquet:** Vibrant fruit, new leather, spices, and toasted oak, blackberry, plum and milk chocolate.

**Palate:** Caresses the palate. Fresh, elegant, refined. Juicy, fruity and delicious.

**Denomination:** DOCG Chianti Classico Riserva Il Poggiale

**Yearly bottle production:** 70.000

**Grapes:** 90% Sangioveto, 5% Canaiolo, 5% Ciliegiolo

**Vinification:** in steel for 16/23gg at a controlled temperature (28°)

**Malolactic fermentation:** Done

**Ageing:** from 12 to 18 months in barrique 50% new

**Bottle refinement:** 12 months

**Type of wood:** Barrique of 225 lt.

**Harvest:** following the half of October

**Hectare gain:** 40/45 q.li/ha

Wine has literally been a part of the Tuscan civilization for over 3,000 years. From the time the ancient Etruscans settled in the gentle rolling hills of Tuscany, viticulture and wine production have been an important element of everyday life and indeed was even considered to be mystical. Tuscany is a much larger region than many people realize and it encompasses many different wine regions and climate types. The one thing most regions have in common is the selection of grape varieties. In general, Sangiovese is the dominant red varietal and Trebbiano is the dominant white varietal. The north west of Tuscany is mountainous and is famous for the beautiful Apuan Alps. The climate in the north is continental with hot summers and freezing winters.
